Year 9 – Preparing for GCSE.

In this ever-changing world languages are more important than ever. Languages open doors and learners knowing one or more foreign languages have more opportunities available to them. By the end of this 2 year course you will be able to communicate confidently and coherently with native speakers and prepare for further language study or future employment.

Welcome to your GCSE Spanish preparation document. Over the next two school years you will study three themes, on which you will be tested at the end of year 11 in a listening, speaking, reading and writing examination. The exam board is AQA and the themes are:

- **Identity and culture**
- **Local, national, international and global areas of interest**
- **Current and future study and employment**

The above themes will be split into eight topic areas and these topics will have a particular grammar focus see below (you will already recognise a lot of the grammar as you covered a lot of this in year 9)

- 1: Me, my family and friends – verb tener and possessive adjectives**
- 2: Home and the area where I live – the verb hay, poder vivir and prepositions**
- 3: My studies, music and TV – estudiar, opinions and justifications**
- 4: Spanish food and sports – present tense cenar/desayunar/almorzar/tomar, preterite tense**
- 4: Health – tiene que/ se deber and hay que**
- 5: Holidays – preterite tense and imperfect tense**
- 6: Relationships, media school – opinions**
- 7: School - opinions**
- 8: Environmental and global issues – future tense and modal verbs**

Below are some suggestions on how to get you prepared. None of these are compulsory, but they will very much help you in starting your course. They are mixtures of websites, and podcasts.



Websites for grammar and vocabulary learning

Weaverham High School have subscribed to a number of great language websites to support your language learning.

1. www.memrise.com (your personal login) this website is great to learn vocabulary for the topics and grammar listed above.
2. www.linguascope.com (username weaverham, password pommes). This website helps you to learn the sounds and spellings of the new vocabulary. The website is split into French, German and Spanish and the level which you require. Check out the great games available to help you learn the new vocabulary
3. www.atantot.co.uk (username mflweaverham, password 6068). This website is great for learning grammar such as the present, past and future tenses and how to use them accurately.
